The criteria to identify students were as follows:

A. All Pell eligible students at NTU were eligible to receive between \$450-\$650 for under grad students and a range of \$100-\$200 for graduate and non-pell eligible students for the Spring 2021 semester. Disbursements were issued in twoinstallments. NTU will issue these relief checks to students to assist in resources need to help them complete the semester, such as food, housing, technology, course materials, child care and health care or other expenses related to the disruption of on-



campus instruction during the Spring 2021 semester. Students who were not Pell eligible <u>did not</u> receive a distribution from the ARP (A)(1) or (a)(4) programs.

(7) Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.
Notification was issued to student in February 2021 regarding the relief funds, the eligibility and distribution process. The Provost, Dean of Students, Director of Finance and Communications worked collaboratively to send notification to students. Throughout the year, social media has been used to reach students and to keep them updated with funding opportunities.

Dear PELL-eligible Student,

NTU will begin distributing SP2021 CARES Act student assistance to <u>only PELL-eligible students</u>. The eligibility for the CAREs funding has been established by the federal government. You are receiving this notification as you have been identified as a "PELL-eligible student".

As with the previous 2020 CAREs student aid distribution processes, we will again require a few things from eligible students before the aid is released. The requirements will be detailed further in this email.

CAREs student aid is a limited financial resource to help students with expenses such as food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and child care.

There is a possibility of future disbursement of aid later in the semester and will be tied to PELL-eligible students who:

- a) are regularly attending class,
- b) have maintained contact with instructors, and,
- c) have been submitting homework and assignments to complete the semester.

In order to prepare for the February distribution, PELL-eligible students are asked to complete the following:

1. Student is to log into the MYNTU email account and send an email to each of your professors to inform them of your personal contact number (cellphone) and your home location. The email to your professors allows them to make connections with you throughout the semester.

If there is a reason for us to send homework packets or supplies to your home location via the "Homework Express", your physical location is critical. The cut-off date to complete this important task is <u>Monday</u>, February 15, 2021.

On February 16-17, 2021, Academic Advisors will verify the communication between you and your professors and forward your name to the Business Office-Accounts Payable to add your name to the check distribution roster. The review will take time.
