NTU Hosts Navajo Nation Presidential and Vice-Presidential Debate

CROWNPOINT, NM - On October 18th, 2022, Navajo Technical University (NTU) hosted the Navajo Nation presidential and vice-presidential debate. Two presidential candidates, President Jonathan Nez and Buu Nygren, and their vice-presidential candidates, Chad Abeyta and Richelle Montoya Chee were given a chance to speak about current concerns of the Navajo Nation.

Virginia Edgewater blessed the debate as NTU's Dr. Delores Becenti, Enrollment Director, and Mr. Cuyler Frank, KCZY Radio Manager, led the discussion giving each candidate five minutes to introduce themselves, explain their strategic plan and top priority in office and preserve the best interest of the people of the Navajo Nation. Starting with the vice-presidential debate, there were questions ranging from modernizing a simpler and more efficient government system within the Navajo Nation to jobs, healthcare, and why the young people often leave the reservation. COVID and Monkeypox also garnered significant discussion as candidates continued to explain their platforms.

Dr. Elmer J. Guy warmly welcomed the presidential debate candidates who responded to their first questions regarding leadership, community involvement, business, and entrepreneurial methods. All candidates had a chance for rebuttal. Toward the end of the debate, each candidate was allowed to ask their fellow competitor a question. All responses from the closing statement were about housing, community investing, and education.

This debate was an excellent chance for the Dine' People to hear and determine their choice in the upcoming election. Navajo Nation Voter Registrars are available at most chapter houses. Navajo Nation voters will head to the polls in November for the general election to determine the next Navajo Nation president and vice-president. Voter registration is also open to Navajos living off the reservation.

All candidates, Jonathan Nez, Buu Nygren, Chad Abeyta, and Richelle Montoya, gave positive feedback for NTU hosting the event.

Environmental Science Undergraduate Student Research Showcase Event

Crownpoint, NM – On October 21st, 2022, NTU's Environmental Science Program organized its 1st Undergraduate Student Research Showcase Event inside the NTU Hospitality Center.

Dr. Abhishek Roychowdhury coordinated the event successfully with sponsors and guests in attendance. Students worked hard during the summer of 2022 at various locations across the U.S. Their research methods include finding ways to clean contaminated water, as Native American communities are more likely to be affected by dirty drinking water. The southwest of the U.S. is experiencing more drought. Thus, studying plant genetics and fungi is essential to help better projections of pinyon survival during drought and future restoration. Student interns acknowledged their instructors and predecessors as they presented their research and what they planned to do shortly in front of the NTU community. Judges were scoring each presentation. As a result, the votes were tallied in the end, and winners were announced.

NTU Receives 4 Million In Funds for Environmental Lab

CHINLE, AZ - On October 11th, 2022, Navajo Technical University presented a groundbreaking ceremony on its new Environmental Laboratory in Chinle, Arizona. The funds for this were allocated when Arizona Governor Doug Ducey signed the historic \$18 billion Fiscal Year 2023 budget toward the Navajo Nation's Road infrastructure projects, veteran services, housing projects, and tribal education programs.

Navajo Technical University will construct an EPA-certified Environmental Lab capable of radiation analysis of soil, water, and air to clean up the toxic uranium processing facilities throughout the region. The \$4 million NTU Environmental Lab at the Chinle Instructional Site will support STEM programs in northeastern Arizona and will provide instruments and facilities to train students and encourage research needed to meet the environmental challenges residents in and around the Navajo Nation face.

Dr. Elmer J. Guy welcomed NTU Board of Regents guests, the National Science Foundation (NSF), the Los Alamos National Lab, Northern Arizona University, and Arizona Representatives. Raymond Redhouse conducted a traditional blessing with songs and prayer. A warm welcome led by Anson Etsitty, Instructor of Dine' Studies Chinle Facility and representing Jonathan Nez, N.N. President was Rholinda Shirley. AZ Representatives Myron Tsosie, Jasmine Blackwater-Nygren, and State Senator Theresa Hatathlie were recognized for their contributions to establishing the Chinle Instructional Site to serve students from rural communities surrounding Chinle, Arizona, an opportunity for community members to attend/receive a higher education near home, a significant development in establishing healthy communities and sustainable economies to keep our culture alive and our people on the Navajo Nation.

Lunch was provided and served by the NTU Culinary Arts Programs, and Chef Lorencita Billiman gave a speech reflecting on traditional meal preparation.

Crownpoint, NM – On October 17th, Navajo Technical University warmly welcomed Gallup McKinley County Schools (GMCS) as they visited the campus for Harvard University's Dr. Jennifer Lewis's lecture on the topic of Printing of Soft Materials in Three Dimensions inside the Hospitality room.

Dr. Jennifer Lewis took the initiative when broadening pathways for underrepresented minority students, postdocs, and faculty in STEM. She presented her work inside the Hospitality center on the materials paradigm and desired rheology for direct ink writing and 3D printing.

GMCS (Gallup High School, Miyamura High School, and Crownpoint High School) students visited NTU to meet with NTU leaders and visit departments to discuss partnerships for dual credit opportunities.
