The Honorable Bill Richardson later delivered shoes to students who attended Na' Neelzhiin Ji'Olta - Torreon Day School in Cedar Hill, NM, and Lake Valley Navajo School. Language preservation is a priority for tribal nations. Students had presented Richardson with dozens of thank-you notes written in the Navajo language. Navajo Technical University staff who assisted Bill Richardson in the charitable event were: NTU Board member Gloria Grant, Student Services Coordinator Jerlynn Henry, and Dr. Elmer J. Guy.

Governor Richardson, who also served as U.S. Secretary of Energy, said he was impressed by NTU's Fabrication Laboratory. Where students train in cutting-edge technologies to research, test, and fabricate airplane and satellite parts, medical instruments, prosthetic devices, hearing aids, or replacement parts for old windmills. The lab houses unique 3D metal printing machines for advanced manufacturing.


