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
NTU Welcomes Mr. Eugene Hult

His children's books relate to official DC Comics, DreamWorks, Nickelodeon, and Marvel characters. He has two published books of poetry and a graphic novel. Gene has worked on scripts for plays, movies, TV shows, interactive toys and websites, and video games. He has a BA in English/Writing from New York University and an MA in English/Writing from the University of Denver.

As an Executive Editor, Eugene Hult worked for publishing houses, including HarperCollins, Scholastic, and Simon & Schuster, for more than 20 years. Originally from New York City, where he lived most of his life, he moved to Houston in 2017 and taught Composition and Humanities at San Jacinto College there. Gene moved to Chinle in early of January 2023 with his dogs, Henry and Arthur, and is thrilled to be teaching at Navajo Technical University.

NTU Courses in the Creative Writing/New Media Program

Although open to all interested students, NTU offers multiple Creative Writing classes for various curricula requirements including:

- ENGL 2310 Introduction to Creative Writing
 Students will review the different types of nonfiction, poetry, and scripts.
- ENGL 2320 Introduction to Fiction Writing
 Students will focus on reading and writing imaginative, fantastic, and realistic fiction in short stories or novel excerpts, digging deeper into the process, skills, and craft of storytelling and narrative.
- ENGL 2330 Introduction to Poetry Writing
 Students may focus on many different kinds of poetry worldwide, concentrating on language, imagery, personal expression, and classic, modern, and experimental poetic forms.
- ENGL 2340 Introduction to Creative Nonfiction
 An overview of the multiple uses of nonfiction narratives, personal essays, blogs, documentaries, and other forms of telling (mostly) true stories.
- ENGL 203 Beginning Writing for Stage & Screen
 Students will read and work on different scripts, including writing for TV, film, video, animation, graphic novels, radio, stage, and video games. We will also watch the material made from existing scripts to analyze the adaptations.

NTU Rodeo Presentation at Crownpoint Elementary

Crownpoint, NM - On January 30th, 2023, NTU Rodeo Coach, Nicole Pino, presented to students inside the Crownpoint Elementary Gymnasium.

Nicole Pino welcomed students (2nd to 5th grade) and staff as she brought rodeo to the classrooms at Crownpoint Elementary. Nicole explained the technique behind the saddle and the competitive sport of the rodeo discipline to throw a rope with a loop around the head, horns, or legs, based on the size and age of the animal, and prevent it from moving.

Crownpoint students roped the dummy and also learned the different types of roping, such as: calf roping, breakaway roping, and team roping.

Traditional Perspectives and Philosophy

Crownpoint, NM - On January 20th, 2023, The NTU Environmental Science and Natural Resources program had a presentation on Traditional Perspectives and Philosophy in Dine' Culture by Dr. Perry James inside the Science and Technology building with instructors Steven Chischilly and Dr. Abhishek RoyChowdhury.

Students listened as Dr. Perry James briefly explained spiritual beliefs and holistic learning on specific cultural values of the Ecology, Fire, and the Earth's four seasons and sacred elements. His work on worldview context creates a sense of holy place, story/song, ceremony, history, ecological sustainability, and philosophy essential to the survival of the Navajo. Students participated in speaking about the building of fire in Navajo culture, from the incipient (beginning stage) of fire from growth to fully developed and then decay (smoke). Fire is used multiple circumstances for ceremonial purposes such as pow wows, the heating of rocks for sweat lodges, and other traditional prayer/song purposes.
