#### **Beef Quality Assurance Training**

Crownpoint, NM – On May 5th, 2023, the Navajo Technical University Land Grant Program hosted a training certification seminar inside the Student Union Building for new members or people updating their certificates to produce beef from the cattle they raise. The program certifies cowboys and cowgirls to commit to following New Mexico and Arizona's BQA principles. Participants learned about the goals and objectives of ensuring consumers that all cattle shipped to a beef company are healthy for consumption.

Beef and dairy products management is handled in a safe and wholesome manner where all sectors of the industry must take responsibility for proper animal care and have knowledge of the importance of carcass quality traits, animal handling, biosecurity, management practice, record-keeping, and other topics that with BQA guidelines.

Dr. Marcy Ward of New Mexico State University and the University of Arizona's Grey Farell Jr presented for this seminar. The certification is valid for up to three years, and a requirement must be to continue with education to maintain certification. The institution is an equal opportunity provider, and if you want to know more, don't hesitate to contact the Land Grant program through the NTU Vet Tech clinic; we will be happy to assist you.

NTU's Veterinary Technology program is accredited by the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA). The AVMA accreditation will enable the NTU Veterinary Technician graduates to qualify for the Veterinary Technician National Examination (VTNE).
