NTU Live Stream of Cody Jesus Invitational Bull Riding

WINDOW ROCK, AZ — On July 15, 2023, Navajo Technical University hosted a Live Stream at the Cody Jesus Invitational Bull Riding inside the Dean C. Jackson Memorial Arena in Window Rock, Arizona. The turnout was a success, and many viewed the sporting event from home through our current Navajo Technical University Youtube Channel, where you can view our updated NTU videos.

The event featured some of the top Navajo bull riders who all competed to become the first bull riding champion in Jesus's first-ever invitational. In appreciation of the Texas Rattlers, the Navajo Nation Navajo Arts and Crafts worked with the President's Office to assemble gift bags for the team members filled with items like cookies with the Navajo Nation seal, leather wallets, t-shirts, and other gifts.

Entertainers like Go the Gorilla are one of the most recognizable mascots in the league. Go the Gorilla hyped the crowd for the event to the fans known for his wild antics. He is a fan favorite and integral to the Phoenix Suns' culture and identity. NTU's Sammy the Skyhawk flew in for the crowd giving away NTU memorabilia. James and Ernie also presented and performed comedy with a positive message to the public.

Navajo Nation President Buu Nygren and the First Lady Jasmine Blackwater-Nygren, along with a capacity crowd of Navajo PBR fans, cheered on the riders as they showed their support at the Cody Jesus Bull Riding Invitational.

President Nygren took the stand and thanked the Texas Rattlers and the dozens of organizers and sponsors who made the PBR invite a free event. Along with his appreciation, the President told the crowd his intent since taking office was to give back. Navajo Nation President Nygren also thanks Cody Jesus for bringing the Texas Rattlers professional bull riding team to the Navajo Nation.

Of the contestants who competed, it wasn't Jesus who got the winning score, even if his ride was only an exhibition. Rough Rock, Arizona's Wyatt Betoney bested 45 riders and won the championship. Betoney was the only rider to ride two bulls the whole night. For his efforts, he got a combined total of 174.5 points.

Wings of America Running & Fitness Camp at Navajo Tech

Crownpoint, NM – On July 26-28, Navajo Technical University collaborated with Wings of American Running & Fitness camp and Silver Stallion Bicycle & Coffee Works. The three-day center at Navajo Technical University incorporated a mountain biking and running curriculum.

Wings of America's Summer Running and Fitness Camps (R&F) are designed to promote healthy lifestyle choices among American Indian youth ages 6-18. Schools and community centers collaborate with local youth programs, educators, and coaches. These FREE day camps underline the importance of regular exercise when many are tempted to enjoy their break in more sedentary ways.

These camps are designed to help participants become familiar with the iconic landscapes of the Navajo Nation while increasing their knowledge of running, mountain biking, and trail building/maintenance.

Silver Stallion partnered with Durango Devo to create its own Devo, or development, program. In partnership with Gallup McKinley County Schools, DEVO/CLUB Rides now serve over 125 riders in 6 programs in Thoreau, Crownpoint, Tohatchi, Navajo, and Gallup.

NTU would like to thank the coaches: Randy Bitsue, Lorenzo Manuelito, and AJ Murphy.

"Being able to assist the youth in a different way from an indoor setting is the best feeling." AJ Murphy remarks on educating and empowering youth. "Progression is always available for each human being; finding it and allowing one to accept it makes it all worth it. Ride bikes, dig trails, and send it."

Crownpoint, NM – On July 21, 2023, Navajo Technical University hosted the annual Navajo Nation Eastern Pageant beginning with Eastern Navajo Baby Princess Brave Pageant, then after the Miss Eastern Navajo, Miss Eastern Navajo Teen, and Miss At'eed Yazhi competitions.

The Miss Eastern Navajo pageant is a contest that tests young women on their knowledge of Navajo culture, language, and history. There were 11 contestants this year; each competition category is ages 6-12 months, 13-24 months, & 25-60 months; all participated in various traditional talents and skills. Contestants showcased silversmithing, dancing, singing, and baking.

NTU had other royalty inside the Wellness Center, including Miss Indigenous San Juan College, Miss Tohatchi Middle School, and Miss New Mexico. Crowning was given to the Miss Eastern Navajo, Miss Eastern Navajo Teen, and Miss At'eed Yazhi competitions. Sashes were given out to the Eastern Navajo Baby Princess and Brave in the traditional category. Toys, food, and baskets were given to contestants and their families.

Danielle Dawes resides in Manuelito, NM. She is Mexican Born into the Bitter Water, Towering House are her paternal grandparents, and the Hairy Ones are my maternal grandparents. She is the 2019-2021 Miss Eastern Navajo and is now the Eastern Navajo Baby pageant coordinator.

NTU Featured Staff/Faculty


This month's featured NTU STAFF member is athletic director George La-France. Mr. LaFrance comes to NTU from Diné College and was inducted into the Navajo Nation Athletic Hall of Fame in a ceremony in Gallup.

George LaFrance is a former Arena Football League offensive specialist. In a twelve-year playing career, he played for the Detroit Drive, the Tampa Bay Storm, and the New Jersey Red Dogs. In 2002, he served as general manager of the San Diego Riptide.

Mr. LaFrance came to the Navajo Nation in 1989 and lived with his family in Beshbito Wash. In addition to working at Dine' College, he taught and coached in the Chinle School District from 1996 to 2010. Before working in the Navajo Nation, LaFrance played twelve years of professional football in the Arena Football League, winning five titles with the Detroit Drive and Storm. He was elected to the Arena League's Hall of Fame in 2011.

LaFrance is now the Athletic Director at Navajo Technical University in Crownpoint, New Mexico.

Today he tends to livestock on 20 acres of farmland and gardens and runs NTU's athletic program. If you see Mr. LaFrance around campus, smile and greet him.
