Navajo Technical University 2nd Annual Trail Ride

Crownpoint, NM - On August 8 - 16, 2023, Navajo Technical University's Chinle instructional site director Arlena "Bo" Benallie led NTU's 2nd annual trail ride with students, staff, and community members to bring awareness to higher education and improve the health of the Navajo Nation.

Upon leaving Chinle, AZ, the ride will promote health, wellness, and Diné culture and teachings. The group headed south onto Hwy 191 to the Nazlini turnoff and then to Burnside Junction, where the group camped. The next day, the ride embarked to Milepost 456 and Window Rock, AZ, before crossing into New Mexico and Yah-ta-hey. The events along the way also included 3k/5K fun runs and walks at select locations along the ride to promote healthy activity. Families and community members who helped support and participated in the awareness welcomed the trail ride to their residences.

"Our trail riders safely made it to our Crownpoint campus! We made the 143-mile trek over nine days from Chinle to Crownpoint with the help of several individuals throughout the journey. We had consistent riders while Chinle recruiters made stops to provide water for the riders and horses. Along the route, we also offer a recruitment drive within the communities. We met many people waving and honking at us and yelling from their vehicles. It was a great experience," said Arlena "Bo" Benallie, who rode the entirety of the event on horseback.

The weather provided much rain as the trail ride traversed into NM from AZ. Halfway through the embarkment on August 13, the ride rolled into Brimhall, where they camped at NTU's Director of Veterinary Teaching Hospital, Dr. Germaine Daye's homestead, welcoming them into her residence. The group spent the night and then galloped east early in the morning to Standing Rock and onto Crownpoint, making 15-19 miles daily. The trail ride held four fun runs since the departure in Chinle, including Ganado, Window Rock, and Crownpoint. Along the journey, individuals participated in the series, which led to great experiences for everyone involved, as NTU hopes to gain more participation in the years to come.

"I'm very thankful for everyone who participated in this event, especially to the families and community members who welcomed NTU into their residence," said Dr. Guy J. Guy, who rode at the event on horseback. "This was a great experience for everyone involved, and we hope to gain more participation."

Navajo Technical University Grant Award Ceremony

Crownpoint, NM – On August 29, 2023, SunShare, a community-solar company, awarded a \$6 million grant to Navajo Technical University toward renewable energy and a \$1.2 million donation to the Coalition to Stop Violence Against Native Women.

Navajo Technical University faculty and staff, Coalition to Stop Violence Against Native Women, and the SunShare team met inside the wellness center to celebrate the partnership of the Navajo Nation's profound connection with the land, sun, wind, and water. These elements are central to our history and pivotal to future energy solutions. Dr. Colleen Bowman warmly welcomed the event as Dr. Sharon Nelson opened with a blessing and introduction. Along with the celebration, Ryedale Largo entertained guests with traditional Navajo songs and dances.

Navajo Nation President Buu Nygren from Red Mesa, AZ, gave insights on the significance of the grant and future aspirations for renewable power in the Navajo Nation, including a recent solar power energy project near his hometown. "We have been a fossil fuel community as we emphasize renewable energy, that as indigenous people, we not only respect these elements but have a deep-rooted responsibility to utilize them sustainably, echoing the wisdom of our ancestors." Navajo Nation Buu Nygren stated. He also thanked the generous donation. Buu Nygren added, "Navajo Technical University is a hub for innovation and thought leadership. NTU invests in education and training directly in the Navajo Nation's prosperous future."

Dr. Elmer Guy welcomed guests and local dignitaries, appreciation for the grant, insights into how the funding will be utilized, and the college's commitment to education and community development—furthering renewable energy and strengthening our community against socio-cultural challenges. "I encourage Navajo youth to champion this fusion of ancestral values with contemporary innovation," Dr. Elmer Guy said. Navajo Technical University's potential and vision lead the charge toward a sustainable future. "As we venture into renewables, we progress technologically and protect our sacred land for future generations." Dr. Elmer Guy added.

Corrina Kumpe, Chief Financial Officer, and Salina Derichsweiler, Director of New Mexico Development, presented SunShare, the grant's purpose, and the award. "We integrate solar into the community into a more beneficial modern solution. Renewable energy is allowing us to regain control over our cherished resources." Corrina Kumpe stated. SunShare and NTU discussed the potential for job creation, from training programs to hands-on solar and wind energy installation, maintenance, and innovation roles.
