DigDeep Visits NTU Kirtland Site

Washington, D.C. — On October 4, 2023, in preparation for the start of the Navajo Nation's first dedicated plumbing training program, the International Water, Sanitation and Hygiene Foundation (IWSH) finished the construction and setup of a new plumbing classroom and wet lab at the Navajo Technical University Kirtland Instructional Site in Kirtland, New Mexico.

The new education facility will offer a 34-credit plumbing certificate program. IWSH developed introductory courses covering plumbing concepts and applications, which will equip learners with the skillsets and understanding needed for a career in the plumbing profession.

Constructed with ASEA Advancing Life funds, this vocational education program will equip students with practical experience and technical skills in a sector currently experiencing worker shortages nationally and on the reservation. NTU's plumbing program will introduce competencies in worksheet safety, drainage systems, water supply systems, plumbing fixtures, blueprint reading, gas piping, and pipe joining.

The first class of this one-year program started with six students. After the program, graduates will be eligible for work as a plumbing apprentice. The hope is that they will desire to be an active part of the solution in their communities to solve water insecurity.

"Our IWSH team, in collaboration with DigDeep, has put together a solid plumbing program that will provide multiple opportunities for the students of NTU," said IWSH North American Program Director Randy Lorge. "It's the first plumbing program for the Navajo Nation in the Four Corners region. The class and wet lab will help provide students with hands-on, practical learning, which can help develop a skilled workforce to support future water and sanitation services in these communities."

The road to a new plumbing training course for the Navajo Nation stretches back to the first IWSH Community Plumbing Challenge hosted by the DigDeep Navajo Water Project in Baca-Prewitt, New Mexico, in 2018. Since then, IWSH has focused on developing courses and a hands-on training facility to provide a pathway for residents to learn and become a part of the plumbing profession.

DigDeep Chief Program Officer Julie Waechter said the need for more trained technicians is a critical challenge to water access across the United States, which will likely impact the quality of water service in the coming years. She said the plumbing program will improve employment opportunities while supporting DigDeep's work to expand water access to every Navajo Nation member.

"I am so proud of what we have been able to do through the partnership between Navajo Technical University, IWSH, and DigDeep to begin training new water technicians and certified plumbers in the Navajo Nation," Waechter said. "NTU, IWSH, and DigDeep are working together to avert this crisis in the Navajo Nation by creating a world-class plumbing certification program with a wet lab for hands-on learning. Partnerships like this bring out the best in academia, the business world, and philanthropic work to solve some of the most intractable challenges of our time; this type of program and this type of partnership are imperative to closing America's water gap."

In addition to IWSH's partners at DigDeep, this project was made possible by generous donations from Ferguson and the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR). The design and installation of the new wet lab and the development of the new training curriculum were mainly due to the contributions from UA Local 412 in New Mexico.

ABET Site Visit at Navajo Technical University

Crownpoint, NM – On October 1-3, 2023, The ABET accreditation for engineering technology met with the Navajo Technical University cabinet members.

NTU warmly welcomed a joint visiting team for our ABET accreditation. A significant part of the work of the Computing Accreditation Commission (CAC), Engineering Accreditation Commission (EAC), and Engineering Technology Accreditation Commission (ETAC) is carried out by teams of program evaluators, each of whom visits an institution that has requested an evaluation of one or more of its computing programs. CAC Team Chair member Shari Plantz-Masters, EAC Team Chair Gary Young, and ETAC Hy Tran represent the entire computing community and have a solemn responsibility to the profession.

Program evaluators (PEV) are expected to understand the general and program criteria thoroughly. PEVs visited with program advisors and representatives to tour NTU program labs, facilities, and classrooms. For a small program, the team interviewed faculty members who teach computing courses in the program. Students also encouraged their impressions of the aspects of the computing program related to the criteria, including advising, the faculty, the curriculum, and the computing and library facilities.

NTU is the first tribal college and university in the nation to hold program accreditation with ABET. Our Electrical Engineering and Industrial Engineering programs have the certification which aligns with any engineering program in the country.

Navajo Technical University Recognized for Accredited Ph.D. Program

WINDOW ROCK, Ariz. — The 25th Navajo Nation Council held its Recognition Ceremony at the Fall Council Session on Oct. 17 at 8 a.m. MDT at the Council Chamber.

25th Navajo Nation Speaker Crystalyne Curley and Dr. Andy Nez recognized Navajo Technical University for establishing the nation's first and the first tribal college in the US, the first accredited Ph.D. program. NTU Deans and professors, including former Chief Justice Robert Yazzie, emeritus, were present. Navajo Technical University received a certificate of recognition from the Navajo Nation Council and is continuing the Education of the Navajo people and working on sustaining and preserving the language.


"Today, this achievement represents a significant milestone in Navajo education and is a testament to the commitment and hard work. I learned more from the students than I shared; I am very grateful for NTU, and all involved continue the excellent work with our students, our incredible growing leaders, and their interested agendas", Dr. Andy Nez commented.

The accomplishment at the University marks a milestone as the first accredited Ph.D. program of its kind at a Tribal College or University. The inaugural doctoral program is designed to produce scholars who can conduct research, teach, and lead in efforts to retain the Navajo culture, language, and leadership. The development of the program is a significant milestone in preserving a language and culture that has been at the focal point of many educators and administrators in the Navajo Nation over the years.

Dr. Franklin Sage is a leading scholar in Education and foundation of research, Diné research in culture and history. Their expertise and guidance will provide a strong foundation in the theory and practice of Diné culture and language sustainability. NTU's program will provide students with a rigorous, interdisciplinary education that draws on history, anthropology, literature, sociology, and cultural studies.

"Our faculty are experts in their fields and are committed to providing students with a supportive and engaging learning environment. The consultation with NTU colleagues, Diné elders, indigenous scholars, community members, and experts elsewhere in North America complements the program's arrangement,"

NTU Nursing Director Inducted into the American Academy of Nursing

Washington, DC — On October 5-7, 2023, Research Associate at Johns Hopkins University School and Navajo Technical University Nursing Director Dr. Michelle Kahn-John and 252 distinguished nurse leaders were inducted into the American Academy of Nursing (AAN) the 2023 Class of Fellows. The inductees are recognized for their substantial, sustained, and outstanding impact on health and health care at the Academy's annual Health Policy Conference. This year's conference theme is "Celebrating 50 Years of Leadership, Policy, and Partnership."

Dr. Michelle Kahn-John is an Indigenous nurse scientist who leads and advocates for culturally safe, respectful, and collaborative research partnerships in Native American communities. She's a transformative advanced practice nurse, has provided leadership in health systems for over 25 years, and continues to offer clinical (psychiatric) and administrative support to hospitals and clinics serving the Navajo Nation.

"As a Diné (Navajo) nurse scientist, my leadership and scientific innovations are directed at addressing the overwhelming disparities in American Indian (AI) mental health and training the next generation of AI and ally researchers. My substantive practice, policy, and research contributions span 27 years. Drawing from my AI culture and scientific knowledge, I developed one of only two Native American theoretical nursing models, the Hózhó Lifeway (HL), a cultural guidepost for policy, research, and systems changes," Dr. Kahn-John stated. "My community-engaged research approach enhances self-efficacy and resilience to address physical and psychological distress in AI communities. As a Diné (Navajo) nurse leader, I am one of 78 PhD-prepared AIAN Nurse scientists and one of the few (less than 0.03%) board-certified AIAN Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioners (PMHNP) in the U.S. My 22 years as a PMHNP and eight years as a nurse scientist uniquely positions me as an advocate for AI communities."

The American Academy of Nursing serves the public by advancing health policy and practice through generating, synthesizing, and disseminating nursing knowledge. Academy Fellows are inducted into the organization for their extraordinary contributions to improving health locally and globally. With over 2,900 Fellows, the Academy represents nursing's most accomplished policy, research, administration, practice, and academia leaders.

Dr. Kahn-John commented, "My career achievements mark my commitment to enhancing health equity in AI communities. As a clinician, educator, and scientist, I possess knowledge and practice expertise that align perfectly with the mission of the Academy. As a newly inducted fellow in the American Academy of Nursing, I'm grateful for the opportunity to reflect on my career achievements."

With her clinical expertise in integrative nursing, traditional Native American medicine, and ceremonial interventions, she advocates for culturally aligned and tailored healthcare interventions


Her most recent research collaboration is focused on preventing youth suicide within two Native American communities in the Great Plains of Northern Montana.

Chinle, Arizona - On October 26th, 2023, the Skyhawks men's and women's basketball team took on the experienced and disciplined Gila Monsters from Eastern Arizona College, which was a highly anticipated competition for the Skyhawks to continue to build their new foundation for year 2.

The Lady Skyhawks opened their inaugural season at the Chinle High Wildcat Den against Eastern Arizona College. NTU women's coach Aanor Louis said. "They are all good basketball players. They are physical, shoot, and pass the ball. I'm just so poised out there all the time."

All NTU games are scheduled because of the NTU men's coach, Rob Floco. With it being a brand-new program, Louis said NTU wants to add more teams to its schedule. As of last Friday, the Lady Skyhawks have ten scheduled games.

"We're going to put our best foot forward," Aanor added. "it's tough—I love that. I love our rivalry. This is a first for many of our great games—it's good for women's basketball. I'm excited to see how well they'll do.," he concluded.

The NTU women's coach said they want to elevate the program.

However, EAC had taken this opportunity to capitalize down the stretch, causing the separation both teams were striving to obtain. Eastern Arizona College was a great competitor for the Skyhawks to see the components the team needed to improve offensively and defensively.

It was the opening weekend for Killers of the Flower Moon, an epic story about the murders of hundreds of Osage Nation citizens in the 1920s directed by Martin Scorsese starring Leonardo DiCaprio, Robert De Niro, and Lilly Gladstone. According to the Red Rock 10 theater manager, the film was 3 hours and 46 minutes long.

Student Sonny Perry stated, "Excellent movie that teaches its viewers about issues and problems in the past that are still relevant today in Native American communities." Sonny is pursuing a Bachelor in Fine Arts in Creative Writing and New Media at the main campus in Crownpoint, NM.


Associate Professor Anita Roastingear, MFA, said, "Growing up in northeastern Oklahoma, I learned about the murders when I was a young girl, and I began to fear for myself and my family because of our Cherokee heritage." Ms. Roastingear teaches HUMN 1180 as a face-to-face class and online.

A quote from the book Killers of the Flower Moon, The Birth of the FBI by David Grann is very telling.

An Osage Chief asked, "Is it murder or simply cruelty to animals?" Indigenous Peoples are resilient. We are still here and shall remain long after the oil in the ground has been forgotten.
