

Crownpoint, NM—On July 31, 2024, Secretary Patricia Trujillo of the New Mexico Higher Education Department (NMHED) enthusiastically introduced the New Mexico College Basic Needs Project to the NTU community. She was accompanied by Dr. Sarita Cargas, a distinguished UNM Professor spearheading the NM Basic Needs Survey and analysis.

Navajo Technical University is excited to announce that it has received funding from NMHED Food Security for 2023 and 2024. Jerlynn Henry, Dean of Student Services, stated, "This grant will play a crucial role in supporting our students' food needs and promoting their academic success and well-being."

Dr. Cargas has passionately visited every university and college to deliver these insightful presentations. Secretary Trujillo was thrilled to make her inaugural visit to NTU, demonstrating NMHED's commitment to fostering strong partnerships with academic institutions.

In addition, NTU has received a SubAward from UNM for the NM State Mental Health Grant, allowing the university to bring in two dedicated student advocates who have received specialized training from the UNM Health Department. Jerlynn continued, "These advocates are committed to identifying and assisting students with social determinants. They have been working alongside us for the past two semesters and have made a significant impact by identifying students in need and providing them with vital resources such as food and gas cards."

Furthermore, the UNM Basic Needs Project is an inspiring interdisciplinary collaboration of UNM faculty, students, and staff. Their collective goal of enhancing basic needs security, including food and housing, for college and university students in New Mexico is truly commendable.

Secretary Patricia Trujillo said, "Our approach involves comprehensive data collection, extensive research, and the development of evidence-based solutions, demonstrating our unwavering dedication and commitment to making a meaningful impact."

In 2023, the Basic Needs Project embarked on a pioneering statewide survey of basic needs at higher education institutions, engaging faculty, staff, and students in a proactive and comprehensive effort to address vital social issues.
