Navajo Technical University Skyhawks vs Yavapai College Roughriders

Crownpoint, NM—On November 1, 2024, the Navajo Technical University Women's Basketball team hosted the Yavapai College Roughriders for their inaugural matchup at the Wellness Center on NTU's Main Campus.

Coach Aanor Louis expressed confidence as his team prepared to take the court for their first home game. Yavapai started strong, quickly establishing a nearly twenty-point lead by halftime. The Navajo Tech squad struggled in the first quarter, making scoring difficult. However, adjustments made during the second quarter helped improve their performance and boosted the players' confidence.

During halftime, the team honored senior Sarah Dennison in her final year of collegiate eligibility. Coach Aanor acknowledged her veteran leadership over the past two seasons and her significant contributions to building the NTU Women's Basketball program. Although Sarah did not play in the game, she supported her teammates steadfastly throughout.

Fueled by the momentum gained before halftime, NTU began to find their rhythm, sinking shots more consistently and tightening their defense. They cut the Yavapai lead down to nine points late in the game. However, despite a strong effort, the Lady Skyhawks ultimately fell to Yavapai College with a final score of 44-60, ending the game on a 7-0 run.



7Gen Center: NAU & TCU Faculty Exchange Program Presentation

Crownpoint, NM – On November 7, 2024, Dr. Jon Reyhner, a professor of education in the Department of Educational Specialties at Northern Arizona University, presented as part of the faculty exchange program between NAU and Navajo Technical University inside the Hospitality center.

The presentation discussed the importance for TCU faculty to know about their students' experiential backgrounds and how they can adapt curriculum in various subject matter areas (i.e., science, government, history, literature, math, etc.) so that students can better understand that subject matter. In addition, instructional methods that have worked well in the past with Indigenous students, like project method, will be presented.

The NTU exchange program was established to meet the higher education needs of residents in Northern Arizona and the Navajo Nation. It provides academic advising and other services to contribute to student success.

NTU Biology Symposium

Crownpoint, NM - On Thursday, November 7, 2024, the Navajo Technical University School of Science and Biology program hosted its annual Biology Symposium at the Crownpoint Campus inside the Hospitality Center.

The symposium, which took place from 1:30 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., was open to the public for in-person and online attendance. During the event, a panel of four current and former students from the Biology program shared their experiences with the program and the research conducted at NTU. Dr. Palmer Netongo emphasized the significance of the Biology Symposium during the official opening ceremony, led by the Chair of the School of Science, Prof. Irene Ane Anyangwe, and NTU Provost, Dr. Bowman.

Several Navajo Technical University (NTU) students participated in summer internships and secured graduate placements. Notable among them are Layla James, Francesca Noble (from the NARI Program), Makeiyla Begay, and Bianca Todacheenie.

Kyra Capitan, a student in the NTU Biology Program, served as the keynote speaker at the symposium. Her presentation, titled "Taking Advantage of Internship Opportunities," focused on her academic journey and the research she conducted at NTU, which helped her gain admission to Harvard University. She thanked the NTU Biology faculty for supporting and encouraging her educational pursuits. Kyra also shared her aspiration to return and educate future generations of the Navajo Nation.

Several NTU Biology students also researched issues affecting Navajo communities. Their projects included Debra Tolino's "Comparative Analysis of Escherichia coli (E. coli) and Coliform Contamination from Wells, Springs, and Municipal Water," Avery Begay's "Endophytic Fungi: Possible Source of Pinyon Tree Decline," David Willie's "Novel Soil Antibiotics against Mycobacterium smegmatis: A Model for Mycobacterium tuberculosis," Della Wilson's research on "Air Microbes with Possible Antimicrobial Properties against Gram-Positive and Gram-Negative Bacteria," and contributions from Danielle Ayza and Syerra Swartz.

2024 N4WPP Water Symposium

Shiprock, NM – On November 15, 2024, High school students from all across the Navajo Nation participated in this year's annual Water Symposium, hosted by Diné College at their south campus in beautiful Shiprock, New Mexico.

The students faced various challenges, including working in groups for a water filter-building contest and participating in a hydrology quiz. The Water Symposium represents a collaboration between Navajo Technical University and the New Mexico Tech Navajo Nation Water Purification Project. This initiative is part of a long-term effort to provide clean drinking water to rural areas within the Navajo Nation. These two institutions have partnered to offer educational and research opportunities for students interested in STEM, hydrology, water resources, community outreach, and leadership. The U.S. Department of Energy, Office of Legacy Management (DOE-LM) currently funds the project.

Students from all participating high schools did an excellent job collaborating to build their team's water filter. Each team received a one-liter plastic soda bottle, sandwich bags filled with gravel, dirt, rice, cotton balls, rubber bands, and coffee filters. They placed the supplies layer by layer inside the pre-cut plastic bottle. Once their prototypes were complete, the testing began. Team members poured dirty water samples through the sand, gravel, and rice layers, ultimately filtering it through a final layer to produce cleaner drinking water. The keynote speaker for the symposium, Mr. Dwight Witherspoon, Water Rights Unit Attorney for the Navajo Nation Department of Justice, spoke to the students about his project, "Preserving Dinetah: Water Security for Generations." Mr. Witherspoon shared insights into his work, emphasizing the importance of the Indian water rights settlement in protecting tribal resources and securing a sustainable future. He discussed the complexities of the Indian Water Rights Settlement, underlining its significance in ensuring sustainable access to clean water for tribal communities.

Dr. Wesley Thomas teaches graduate and undergraduate courses and is currently the Interim Dean of the School of Graduate Studies and Research. He belongs to the Hashtl'ishnii clan on his mother's side and the Tábaahá clan on his father's side. His maternal grandfather is Kinyaa'áanii, and his paternal grandfather is Tsi'naajinii. He is from Mariano Lake, NM. Dr. Thomas retired as a Full Professor and Dean of the School of Graduate Studies and Research at Navajo Technical University (NTU) in May 2021.

Dr. Thomas graduated from Thoreau High School in May 1973. He earned his AA degree from Navajo Community College in Tsaile, AZ 1975. He continued his education and obtained a BA in 1994, an MA in 1996, and a PhD in 1999 from the University of Washington in Seattle, WA.

Upon joining NTU in January 2011, Dr. Thomas took the initiative to develop the BA degree program in Diné culture, language, and leadership studies and established the School of Diné Studies. Subsequently, he established an MA program in Diné culture, language, and leadership in 2013, leading to the university's accreditation with the HLC.

Dr. Thomas was involved in establishing a Ph.D. program focused on Diné culture and language studies before retiring. He developed the initial proposal and curriculum for the degree. Before joining NTU, Dr. Thomas served as the Academic Dean at Diné College (DC) for four years. Additionally, Dr. Thomas played a crucial role as the Founding Director of Indiana University's First Nations Cultural and Education Center.

In his retirement, Dr. Thomas actively serves as the Co-Director of GALACTIC (Global Arts, Language Arts, Cultural Traditions of Indigenous Communities). Dr. Thomas also serves as the board of directors president for The Heartbeat Music Project. This project collaborated with Navajo Technical University and was awarded the Lewis Prize from New York City in 2022. The project aims to fulfill Dr. Thomas' dream of providing violin education. Dr. Thomas expressed, "It is now in the hands of Diné children to learn the instrument."

"I am glad to be back to be of help as the Interim Dean. Aside from that, I am amazed at the growth of NTU and the many new faces. I am teaching three courses this fall 2024: an undergraduate leadership class, a master's theory class, and a doctoral analytical class," Dr. Wesley Thomas stated.
