

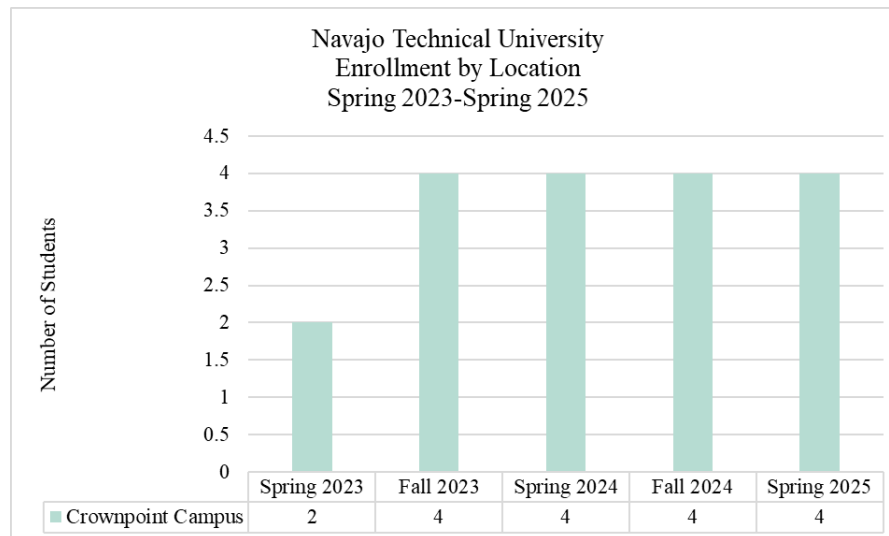
Bachelor of Science: Environmental Engineering

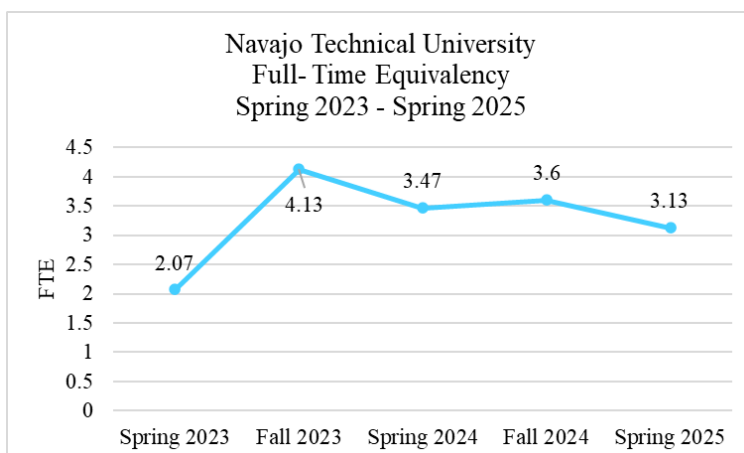

Graph 2, Enrollment by Full- Time Equivalency:

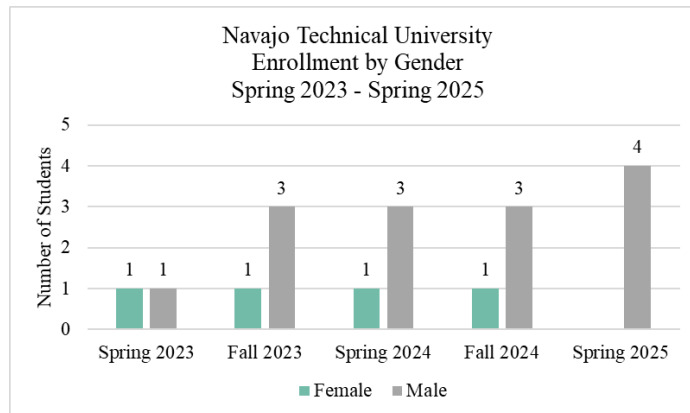

NTU utilizes New Mexico Higher Education definition and calculations to determine FTE:

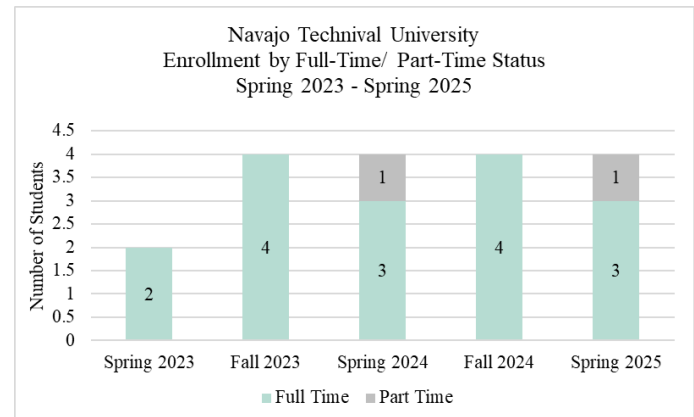
Undergraduates FTE =

Graph 3, Enrollment by Gender:



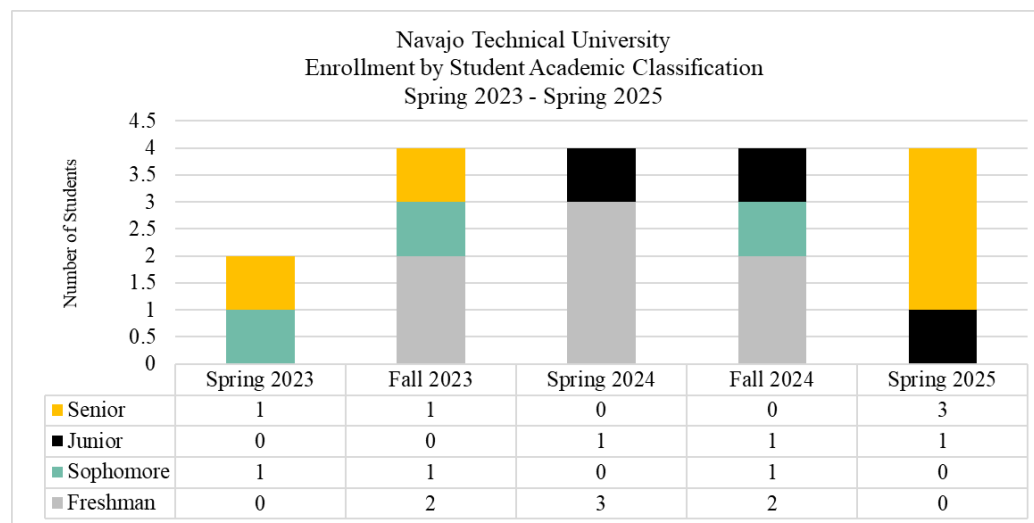
The graph above represents the enrollment by male or female students that are enrolled in the Environmental Engineering program.

Graph 4, Enrollment by FT/ PT Status:



- Full- Time students are considered to be enrolled with 12 or more credit hours.
- Part- Time students are considered to be enrolled with 11 or less credit hours.

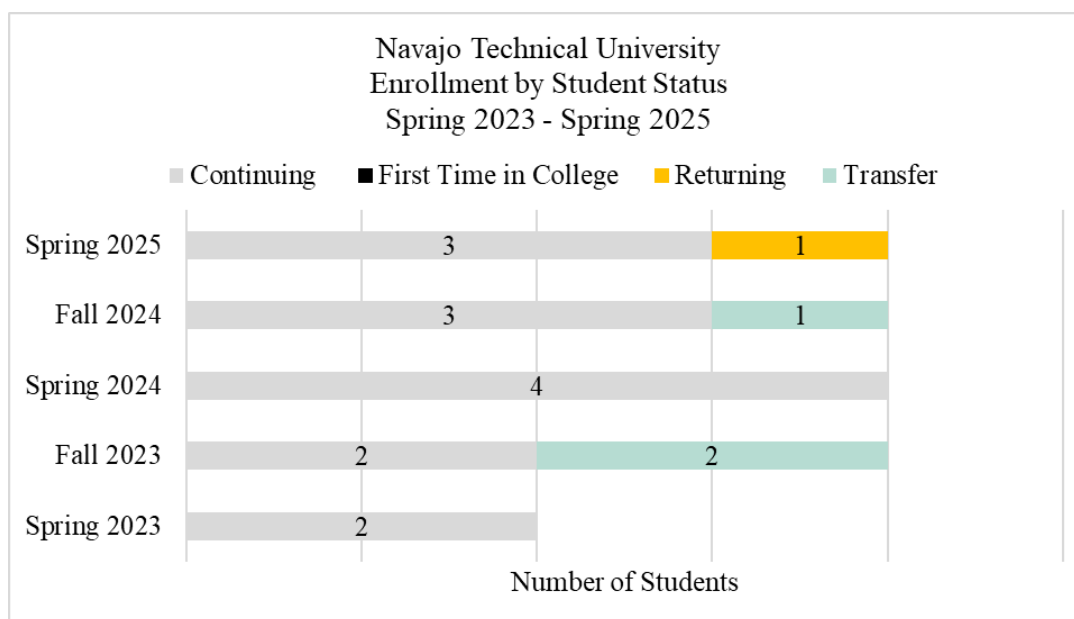
Graph 5, showcases the student academic classification within the program.



Student academic classification refers to:

- Freshman- A student who has completed 30 or less credit hours
- Sophomore- A student who has completed 31-59 credit hours
- Junior- A student who has completed 60-90 credit hours
- Senior- A student who has completed 91 or more credit hours

Graph 6, Student Status refers to the classification of enrolling students during a specified semester.



Continuing students: students who have continued their studies from Fall to Spring, or Spring to Fall semesters, without *stopping out*. (*stopping out* refers to a student who stopped attending the university and did not return during a fall or spring semester).

First- Time in College: students who has no prior post- secondary experience attending any institutions for the first time at the undergraduate level.

Returning: students who have stopped out for at least one semester (fall or spring semester) but have re- enrolled at Navajo Technical University to continue from seeking a degree or certificate.

Transfer: students who are entering the reporting institution for the first time but known have previously attend a post- secondary institution.
