Associate of Applied Science – Registered Nursing (78 Credits)

The Associate of Applied Sciences Registered Nursing program is for students who are interested in pursuing an Associate Degree in nursing. Through this Associate RN Degree program, students will learn the specific skill sets to fulfill requirements of an associate degree RN program. Upon successful completion of this program, students are awarded an Associate of Applied Science Degree as a registered nurse (RN), will be eligible to take the National Certifying Licensing Exam (NCLEX) for Registered Nurses and will be eligible to be employed as a licensed registered nurse.

Student must be admitted into the AAS-RN program. **Science prerequisite courses require a minimum grade of “B” (3.0 GPA). Cumulative GPA for students applying to the RN program is 2.5 GPA (General Education require a grade of “C” (2.0 GPA), Prerequisites course require a grade of “C” (2.5 GPA) and all other science prerequisite course require a grade of “B” (3.0 GPA). Once admitted into the RN program all RN program courses require a grade of “B” 3.0 GPA or higher.** Students are required to have or obtain current Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) or Basic Life Support (BSL) training prior to beginning their nursing internship. The appropriate level of CPR training is the CPR/BLS for Health Care Providers and should be obtained from the American Heart Association. In addition, students are also required to have a physical exam and current tuberculosis test (PPD), as well as a clear background check to be admitted into clinical internship placement
